GEA JOHNSON
ASU Track and Field

The defending NCAA Heptathlon champion and one of America's top multi event performers, Gea Johnson finished 2nd at the TAC Championship and fourth at the Goodwill Games. Johnson was named the 1991 College of Public Program's Graduate of the Year, and is a 1991 GTE Female Academic all-American of the year. In 1990, she won the Pac-10 championship in the long jump and currently holds the ASU school record in each event of heptathlon. An all-America, Johnson placed second at the 1989 TAC Championships, was a 7th place finisher at the 1989 World University Games, and is a member of the U.S. National team. She was named winner of the Dial Award as the nation's top female scholar-athlete. Gea is a senior majoring in Communications and holds a 3.97 cumulative G.P.A. Mother is Sally Johnson. Born on September 18, 1967. Full name is Gea Machel Johnson.



BRIAN GYETKO
ASU Tennis

The first player in ASU history to earn all-America honors in both singles and doubles in the same year. Gyetko is the winner of five collegiate titles, and has been ranked the No. 1 singles player at ASU for the past 3 years. He is currently ranked No. 2 in the nation in doubles, and will participate in the NCAA Tennis Tournament this year. Brian was a squad member of the 1990 Canadian Davis Cup and a three-time NCAA qualifier. Gyetko is a member of TAU BETA PI, National Engineering Honor Society (Top 10% of class), member of PI TAU SIGMA, and National Honorary Mechanical Engineering Fraternity (Top 35% of class). Brian has been named winner of the ASU/Citibank Scholar award in 1987, 1988, 1989, and 1990. Majoring in Aerospace Engineering, Gyetko owns a 3.64 cumulative G.P.A. Parents are Horst and Irene Gyetko. Born on January 26, 1968. Full name is Brian Robert Gyetko.
